There is a time of day that has always mesmerized me. It is that time just before the sun breaks the horizon. You can begin to see creation come to light with color, but not enough to define its details. Everything is beginning to look warm with oranges and reds, even when the air or wind might be cold or damp. Why, you might ask? Because at this moment anything is possible. The day that stands ready to be embraced can be filled with anything. It can be the best day of your life or your worst. It can be the day it all begins anew or the day the grind become too much to handle. It can be a day that lives in infamy or a day like any other day. It can be a day that begins with sunlight brightness and ends with snow, or vice versa. But no matter what the day will become, like a rollercoaster ready to hit the tracks with all sorts of us ups, downs, twists, and turns there is a brief yet wonderful pause right at the beginning.

It is that image and moment of pause that has garnered the most attention for me. I spent my third year in seminary serving as the pastoral intern of a congregation in St. Petersburg, Florida. Being that the City of St. Petersburg occupies the peninsula across the bay from Tampa Bay, Florida, there was no shortage of sunrises. On days when there wasn't a storm looming on the horizon, you could walk on the beach and it would feel as if creation was taking a breath, preparing itself, for the day that was about to commence. It was often a silent moment. One full of mystery, wonder, fear, and excitement, all balled into one brief instant. I remember sitting on the beach with my back to the rising sun and thinking, "I wonder if this is what it is like to encounter God?" The story that was circling through my head is the story from 1 Kings where Elijah meets God on Mount Horeb. The text reads as follows:

¹¹ He said, "Go out and stand on the mountain before the LORD, for the LORD is about to pass by." Now there was a great wind, so strong that it was splitting mountains and breaking rocks in pieces before the LORD, but the LORD was not in the wind; and after the wind an earthquake, but the LORD was not in the earthquake; ¹² and after the earthquake a fire, but the LORD was not in the fire; and after the fire a sound of sheer silence. ¹³ When Elijah heard it, he wrapped his face in his mantle and went out and stood at the entrance of the cave. Then there came a voice to him that said, "What are you doing here, Elijah?" (1 Kings 19:11-13, NRSV)

God wasn't in the busyness, the chaos or goings and doings of life. Instead, God was in the sheer silence. God was there in the mystery of the new day, the opportunity for something different to happen, something new to take place. God didn't jump out at Elijah and say, "NOTICE ME!" Instead God waited for Elijah's own heart to pine for God's presence, for his soul to innately respond to God's coming near, before the Voice called out to him. It is that sheer silence that I see in the dawn of a new day. That moment, well before we are lost in the hus-

tle and bustle of life, that God truly comes near to us; we need only listen for it. Now that is not to say that God doesn't come near to us throughout our day, always yearning for our attention, but it means there are moments when God might be even nearer than we can imagine; we need only pause and listen.

A new year is before and we, as a congregation of God's people in this place, are sitting amid the inhalation of creation's new breath; the sheer silence of what might be and what will be. How we respond to this silence will make all the difference in the months to come. Will we sit and busy our hearts and minds with worries, fears, playing out situations or scenarios that haven't happened? Or will we follow Elijah's lead and let our hearts, our souls, do the talking for us? I am beyond excited to see all that God will accomplish through us in the year that is coming; all the new learnings we will encounter together with the Holy Spirit as our guide. God is and has always been up to wondrous things through our congregation. Sometimes it is being reminded of them that creates the energy and the renewed sense of passion for mission and ministry to begin the journey again. So, remember the times that were. Cherish the stories that have gotten us to this place. Quiet your mind. Open your heart. And listen to the silence, listen to creation taking its breath. God is near.



Council Report submitted by Karen Weinstein

"As each one has received a special gift, employ it in serving one another." - 1 Peter 4:10 For the past 2 years, much work has gone into planning and implementing change. The strategic plan completed in 2016 paved the way for the call of Pastor Marcus Bigott. At his installation on August 6, 2017, Pastor Marcus was given a safety helmet and vest as Emanuel's is now a congregation and facility under renovation and new construction. As he learns the rhythm of Emanuel's and works to meet the expectations as enumerated during the Call process, Pastor Marcus may often feel he actually needs to wear the helmet and vest as he implements change and works to support or re-energize existing programs.

The most pressing change involves the facility. Talks continue with the architect, Jim Heck, as we work to implement changes to the actual building. The plan seemed to be going in the direction of construction of a multipurpose building joined to the sanctuary by a commons area at the point of the bell tower stairwell and entrance. An elevator that would provide access to the organ loft, sanctuary and fellowship hall would be located in the bell tower area. Members have not actually voiced support for the multi-purpose building, but members have asked questions about what would be done with the existing educational wing and fellowship hall. Consequently, given that the elevator seems to be a necessity whether we have a multi-purpose building or not, what about starting with a less grandiose plan which includes the elevator and renovation of the fellowship hall. The architect has stated that to place the elevator in the bell tower area, there will need to be some build out of that area to accommodate both the elevator and a stairwell. We hope to see a preliminary drawing in the next few weeks to see if this is feasible with the expectation that there is a more concrete plan to present at our annual meeting to be held January 28, 2018.

Along with authorizing the architect to complete the feasibility study concerning the elevator installation (as well as all access points to include the existing elevator on Mountain St., the Council authorized Jim Heck to develop exterior and interior layouts for an expanded Day School facility, along with recommendations for parking and possibly moving the Garden of Eatin'. The Day School cannot continue to exist without expanding the existing facilities. Thus, Emanuel's has come to the crossroads of needing to make a decision as to whether or not the congregation supports the continuation of this highly acclaimed educational program. Prior to the annual meeting when a decision must be made, the council plans to hold an open forum for members to discuss the 2014 Day School Task Force findings and the facility needs and cost of facility expansion.

With an eye on the cost of renovation and change, the Council has approved a proposed Church Budget for 2018. The cost has jumped from the 2017 Budget of \$513,289 to the 2018 Budget of approximately \$571,000. Last year, the \$50,000 approved for architectural evaluations and planning was not included in the budget. To date, \$28,000 has been paid for initial evaluations and planning. These funds came out of investment accounts. This year, the architectural cost projection for fees of \$42,000 has been included in the budget. Additional funds have been added for staff. In the 5 months that Pastor Marcus has been our very capable leader, he has excelled in energizing the congregation, forging forward to create change while meeting the needs of church members and working to rebuild community relationships. However, the energy and time required to promote a dynamic youth program cannot continue to be met by Pastor Marcus. A part-time youth director cannot be found. Consequently, included in the proposed Budget is the cost of a full time Associate Pastor or a Deacon whose focus will be developing and facilitating programs for youth and young families. The individual filling this position would also be able to assist Pastor Marcus as needed. The 2018 budgeted cost only six months financially as the call process would need to be followed and a pastor or deacon would most likely not begin until, at least, June.

In his free time, among many activities, Pastor Marcus has spearheaded the updating of the Personnel Policies which will go into effect 1-1-18; has rewritten job descriptions with an eye to completing staff evaluations in January; is updating the church Constitution to meet ELCA guidelines; has pulled all Gift, Memory and Endowment policies into 1 Gift Acceptance Policy; along with 4 church members, has gone through the process of becoming a certified Life Care advocate and is facilitating talks with GRMC to develop a program within Emanuel's and other community organization to help with Life Care planning; has formulated job descriptions for church committees as dictated by the church Constitution to re-create and energize a church infra-structure. This has all been done in an effort to present the proposed ideas to the congregation at the 2018 annual meeting.

Emanuel's Day School News

January marks a return to "normal routine" for the Day School families and staff following a busy and merry Christmas season. It began before Thanksgiving with a lighted parade and concluded with a very successful Christmas play and concert presentation with over one hundred thirty-five family members, friends and members of our congregation in attendance. Holiday festivities behind us now, we are re-focusing our attention on letters, sounds, writing, counting, science concepts, site words, colors, shapes and motor skill development.

The Day School will bring three new toddlers from the waiting list on board this month to fill spaces vacated by families who have moved out of town and one child who is moving from the toddler to the Pre-K3 classroom.

This month the Day School Advisory Panel will turn its attention to the 2018-2019 school year. There will be an assessment to determine revenue needs and tuition/fee levels that will remain competitive in the Seguin area market while supporting our quality program providing experienced, professional classroom teachers with Pre-K3 and Pre-K4 support through our now three-year-old Literacy Skills program. We are fortunate to have had two teachers this year familiar with and incorporating Montessori activities into the Pre-K classroom environments.

Registration for the 2018-2019 school year, in addition to summer session 2018, will take place in late February for our currently enrolled families and in March for prospective families in the community.

January also marks the arrival of the annual Congregation Meeting during which time we will discuss the current status and future of the Day School ministry of Emanuel's Lutheran Church. This will include short- and long-terms goals for growth in education and childcare. Proposed growth will include a recommendation for renovation of an aged facility that is currently unable to deliver desirable and necessary services and facility usage to families seeking care of younger children, hot meals, updated security features and payment/accounting options. In order to be competitive in our area, we must make improvements to our facility, educational and nutritional offerings and offer services to families with children under the age of eighteen months.

As always, all of us at Emanuel's Day School appreciate and thank you for your continued support.

A Note About Worship Times

It has been a great journey, not only to the manger, but also experiencing a relatively new service time. We introduced this change right before Advent began to simplify service times and changes throughout the month of December. Upon suggesting the time change, it was brought to my attention that Emanuel's had previously celebrated a 10:30am service in its not so distant past so, for many, it was like riding a bike!

I first want to thank you for taking that risk and changing this Advent. It has provided a great place to incorporate new things into worship, bringing new music and additional vocal and instrumental leadership to our service, as well as experiment with a renewed service time. For all of this I am extremely grateful. Now that Advent has come and gone, and we are celebrating the 12 days of Christmas, it is time to decide where we turn next. One of the exciting pieces the 10:30am service time allows for is a renewed way of engaging our children and youth in education.

While I was going through the interview and call process with Emanuel's, the reintroduction of "Children's Church" into the Sunday morning worship routine was discussed. This would provide a place for our preschool to 4th grade children and youth to engage the readings of the morning's service through video, crafts, fellowship, movement, and activities geared to them specifically. This allows parents and guardians and the youth in their life to engage in the lessons of the day that make sense to their learning styles. It also provides the space for the much-needed movement our youngest worshippers need to engage the Gospel.

We have a dedicated team of leaders that are willing to take on this renewed way of learning in our congregation in the coming year. This later service time also allows for what we are going to call "5th Sunday Fundays" in the coming year, which will be dedicated 5th Sundays for potluck and fellowship; maybe even a congregation-wide game or two, learning opportunities, and movies. This allows our congregation to be gathered together, sharing in fellowship with one another, instead of being separated by services or having to deal with randomly changing service times.

I also realize that this is only one piece of a much larger pie. There are participants in our music ministries that would need to leave their respective classes early to practice for worship if the service stayed at 10:30am. There are some that cannot make this service time work as it interferes with family events and travel. And additionally, I know it places our service end time much later than in previous years and beating our denominational sisters and brothers to the good restaurants thus becomes a problem. But in all seriousness, I think there are great possibilities for this later worship time and have asked that we extend it through the month of January. We will end the month with our regularly scheduled Annual Meeting, Sunday, January 28th where we will vote on and adopt our new Sunday schedule and service time or times.


