





Lastly, participants will step the last assistant who will pour the wine and share these words, "the blood of Christ shed for you." Place your glass in the small silver bowl at the end of the first pew as you return to your seat. If you wish to come forward and not receive either element, cross your arms for a blessing.

October is Clergy Appreciation Month!

Below is an excerpt from a letter sent from Bishop Briner, with some paraphrasing, that is a reminder of what Pastor Marcus, Pastor Kelsie, Pastor John, and Pastor Darwin have been dealing with since early 2020.

Giving Thanks

Pastors have faced unprecedented challenges to doing ministry in the face of this pandemic. They have had to make difficult decisions about worship, Bible study, small group meetings, funerals, weddings, precautions, congregational meetings, schools, and more. Much of the ministry had to continue, which meant learning new technologies, giving pastoral care without sharing physical space, and preparing for worship in new ways. This has been an anxiety-producing job for church pastors. Therefore, we call upon all ministry sites to give thanks to pastors. Individuals and groups can write notes of encouragement, send messages, or make calls to thank their pastors.

Emanuel's Church Council will recognize our pastors during worship today. Everyone is encouraged, in their own way, to reach out to our church leaders and let them know they are supported, cared for, and loved.
